Wild Landfill - Habitat creation in the post-industrial landscape

The legacy of industry and waste disposal is one of nature loss and pollution of the natural environment. It has seen the degradation of land and soils and reduced biodiversity. Wild Landfill is an NRW multi-agency project to begin the reversal of this trend incorporating all aspects of Sustainable Management of Natural Resources into its brief.

- Conversion of 4 brownfield waste landfill sites into multiple benefit post industrial nature regeneration areas meeting many WG/NRW legislative and SMNR policy drivers
- 50,000 trees planted across 4 sites Right tree in the right place
- Mosaic/Edge connected habitat creation
- Hedge expansion and connectivity strategy
- · Carbon sequestration in trees and soils
- Flood Storage integrated into River Braint flood mapping scheme
- Over 100 acres of donor wildflower meadow created on the surface of millions of tons of waste. Seed collection and distribution will occur across both counties.
- 20 new ponds and scrape areas with shallow margins to increase biodiversity
